

# Pet Owner Fact Sheet: Canine Mast Cell Tumors

#### WHAT IS IT?

► The most common malignant skin cancer in dogs. Mast cells are a part of the immune system often involved in allergic reactions. This is why mast cell tumors (MCT) can be red, itchy and swollen.

### WHAT DO I SEE?

Any lump or bump can be a MCT. This tumor has a wide range of appearances, from normal to red and bleeding; from raised and superficial to very deep and fixed; they may feel soft and fluctuant or firm.

### HOW DO THEY DIAGNOSE A MCT?

Most MCTs are easily diagnosed with needle aspiration biopsy. A surgical biopsy can be necessary to select the best treatment. If biopsy indicates a high grade tumor, the dog has an increased risk of death.

# WHAT MCT ARE DIFFICULT TO TREAT?

- ► Larger tumors, rapidly growing and those in specific locations or those that have spread.
- Dogs can have more than one at the same time and can have several in their lifetime

## WHAT IS THE BEST TREATMENT?

Most important treatment is surgery. Some dogs might need anti-cancer drugs and/or radiation therapy.

The majority of MCTs will be cured with surgical excision
