

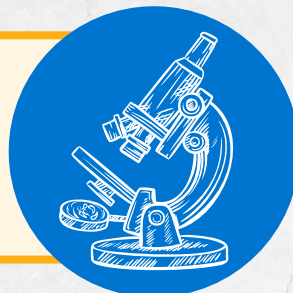
SEVEN MOMENTS OF RESPONSIBLE CANINE PYODERMA TREATMENT

MORE CYTOLOGY
MORE BACTERIAL CULTURE
TOPICAL ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY
FIND & CONTROL PRIMARY CAUSE

CONFIRM PYODERMA

Clinical signs + Cytology
(e.g. not *Malassezia* dermatitis)

Decide on the
TREATMENT MODALITY
Topical +/- systemic

TOPICAL TREATMENT

is always indicated. Treat until lesions resolved.

There is good evidence for efficacy of topical therapy alone for surface & superficial pyoderma, including MRSP infections

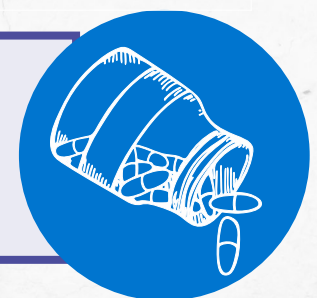

In some cases consider adding
SYSTEMIC TREATMENT
(e.g. deep pyoderma)

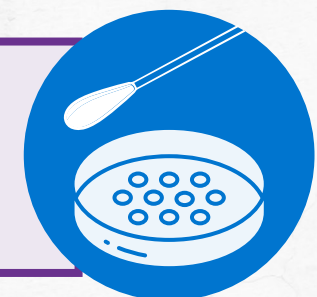


**ANTIBIOTIC
GUARDIAN**
Keep Antibiotics Working

Always **CULTURE** when previous treatment has failed, if repeated prior exposure to antimicrobials or in areas with a high MRSP prevalence

TREATMENT DURATION

Aim for shorter courses (2 weeks for superficial pyoderma/ 3 weeks for deep pyoderma) and recheck before stopping therapy. Treat until pyoderma lesions resolved.

Find and correct or manage **PRIMARY CAUSE**
(e.g. ectoparasites, allergies, endocrinopathies)
